
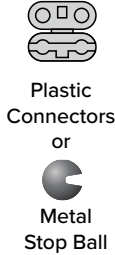

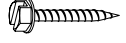

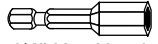
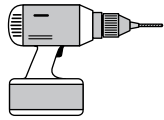


RAS - Installation Instructions Chain Replacement

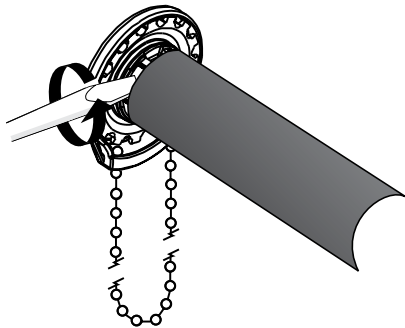
Hardware Included					Tools Required
					
Clutch	Plastic Connectors or Metal Stop Ball	1/4" x 5/8" Self Tapping Screws	1/4" x 1" Wood Screws (If requested)	Self Tapping Phillips Screws for Tension Device	Phillips Head

1. Remove Shade from Brackets

Lift the clutch (chain) side of the shade up then pull clutch out of bracket. If it "sticks" in bracket use a screw driver to gently wedge out.

2. Remove Clutch

Place the shade on a flat stable surface. Using a small flat head screwdriver pry the clutch away from the metal tube until it is loose enough to pull out by hand.

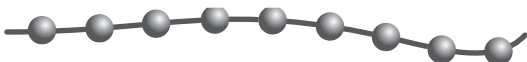


3. Roll Shade Up

By hand roll shade up until bottom rail is hanging down two inches.

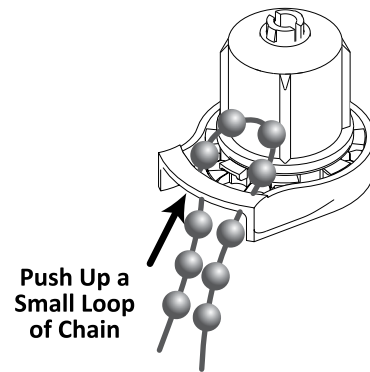
4. Determine the Length of Chain

The length of chain is determined on many variables including window length and accessibility. If you need assistance contact a Roll-A-Shade Representative.



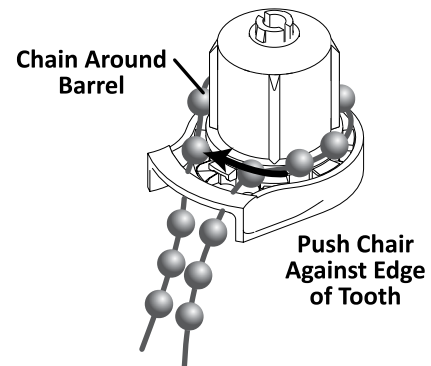
5. Insert Chain

Hold the clutch by the base. With your other hand, push small loop of chain under the chain guide.



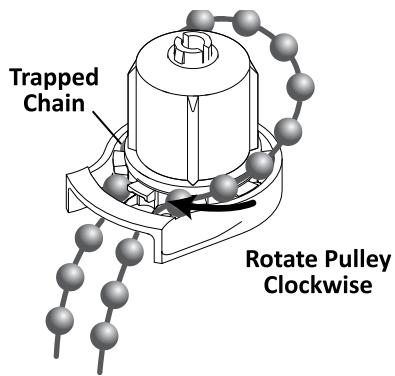
6. Trapping Chain

Firmly push the chain against the left bottom tooth edges.



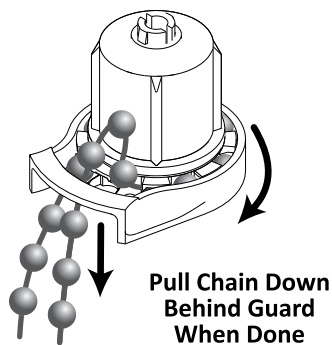
7. Rotate Chain Around Gear Teeth

After a the chain slides into first tooth groove, gently pull the chain around until the gear rotates trapping the chain in the clutch.



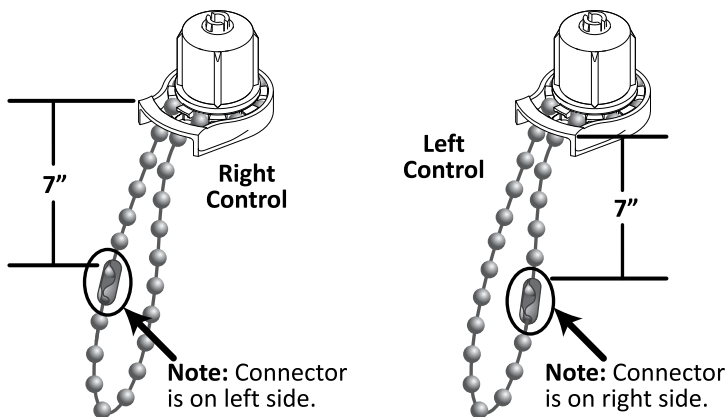
8. Remove Slack

Pull the excess chain thru the guard until all slack is removed.



9. Setting the Right or Left Control

For a right side control, extend the chain 7" and connect the remaining chain with chain connector to the right side. For a left side control, extend the chain 7" and connect the remaining chain with chain connector to the left side.



10. Thread Tension Device on Chain.

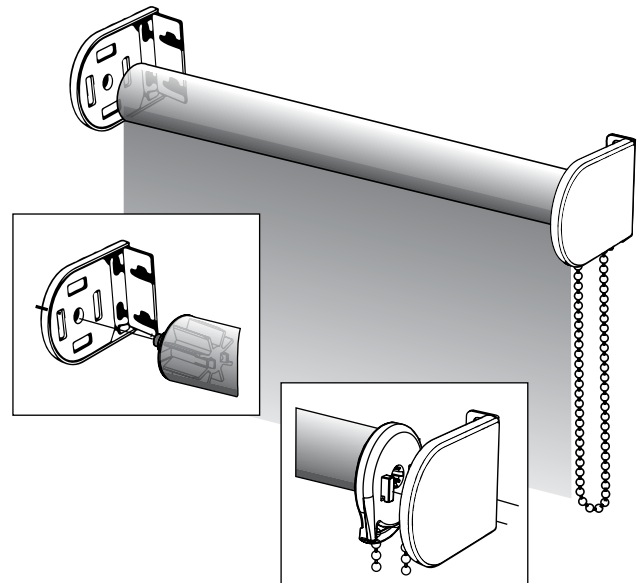
11. Insert Clutch

Insert clutch into tube making sure the chain is hanging down. The clutch will be a tight fit into the tube and may require using a rubber mallet.

DO NOT TWIST CLUTCH IN

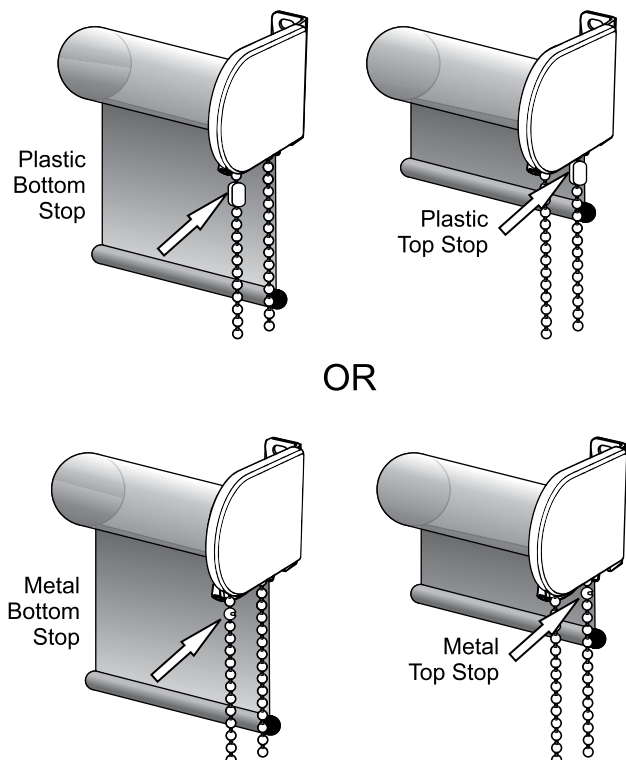
12. Install Shade

Put the spring loaded pin into the round hole of the bracket. Keeping the pin end secured in it's bracket, insert the hook arms on the clutch straight into the two hook arm receiver holes on the bracket. Once the two hook arms are through the holes, gently pull down on the clutch until the two hook arms have locked securely to the bracket. The bottom of the clutch should always point straight down.



13. Install Plastic Connectors or Metal Stop Ball to Bead Chain

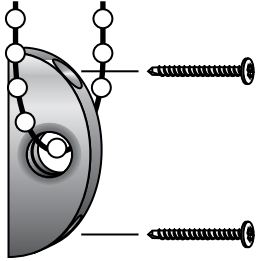
Pull the rear chain to lower the shade to appropriately 1/4" above sill and attach connector or stop ball to upper most bead on front chain closest to the clutch. By attaching this connector or stop ball you will set how far the shade will lower. Pull the front chain and raise the shade so the bottom rail is 5" below the shade and attach a connector or stop ball on the back chain at upper most bead.



14. Install the Chain Anchor

The chain anchor is a plastic piece that is attached to the chain to secure it from possible accidents. Position the chain anchor on the window frame so that the chain anchor and chain do not interfere with raising or lowering the shade. The chain anchor should be installed without stretching or pulling down on the chain. Leave a little play through the chain anchor to allow the chain to pass freely. Do not twist or cross the bead chain. Secure the anchor with Phillips screws in both upper and lower holes.

Warning: Failure to use the tension device may cause injury or death.
